



Markus Sehr Director

Markus was born 1977 in Cologne. He studied theater-, film-, and media studies, political science, english and philosophy. Between 1999 and 2004, he worked as a copywriter at Springer & Jacoby, Hamburg. From 2004 to 2007, he studied film directing at the ifs international film school in Cologne. 2008 he won a grant of the center of medial founding of NRW.

Since then he works as a freelancing director for the advertising industry and creates feature films for theater and television.

Markus's first theatrical feature "Eine Insel namens Udo" (an island called Udo) was released in 2012. In 2015 his black humour comedy "Die Kleinen und die Bösen" (the little and the bad ones) starring Christoph Maria Herbst was nominated with the Metropolis award in the category "best directing for theater".

When Markus works as a director for television he cooperates with important german TV stations. He realized several episodes for the ZDF series "Friesland" and the comedy show "Das Institut – Oase des Scheiterns" produced by BR. For this the german comedy he won 2018 the award in the category "best innovation".

In 2019 Markus Sehr will realize two movies for german public television. "Harter Brocken 4: Die dunkle Seite des Mondes", will be produced by ARD. By order of ZDF Sehr will direct the comedy/ thriller "Mord geht immer - Der Koch ist tot".

Markus Sehr's main interest as a director remains working with the actors within the comedy film genre.
